





# **President's Report**

# **Executive Director's Report**

I am pleased to submit the Executive Director's Report for the CHHA-NL AGM 2023-2024, which will focus on the key outcomes from the past year and look ahead to the challenges for the coming year. As always, there have been lots of things going on as usual, especially with the Fund Development and Programs Services Staff.

This past year saw the completion of year two of the CHHA-NL Strategic Plan (2022-2025). This coming year will see the third and final year of working on achieving the four strategic goals which can be found in this report. This means that the board members, staff, and key volunteers will begin the process of creating a new three-year plan in October 2024 for implementation in Spring 2025.



As noted in previous annual reports, the association earned an initial five-year Accreditation with the Imagine Canada Standards Program in 2014, and a second, five-year Accreditation in 2019. To maintain good standing with this program, the association must submit Annual Compliance Reports that show the association's compliance with a random selection of criteria that changes annually. This ensures that the association continues to operate with a high degree of quality in the areas of Board Governance, Finance, Fundraising, Staff Management and Volunteer Involvement. An application for another five-year cycle will have to be submitted to Imagine Canada this coming year, with the process starting in October 2024 for implementation in Spring 2025.

The association continues to offer a diverse number of quality programs and services for its members and the general public and includes such things as an In-person Lip Reading Courses, an online lip reading course called Read Our Lips (which is franchised to an Australian group that serves people with hearing loss), Hearing Screening Program, Loans and Sales of Hearing Assistive Technology (HAT), Hearing Loss Webinars, Presentations, Public Displays, ARC (Advocacy, Readiness, Connection) for hard of hearing youth between the ages of 18 and 30 years of age, to name some of the key programs and services. Also, many of the association's information handouts have been revised and new ones developed; one in particular is a new **Guidebook for Parents of Children with Hearing Loss** that has been well received across the country. As many of you know, the association must fundraise almost its entire annual budget, something it has done since its inception in 1984. The main source of revenue is the Ultimate Dream Home (UDH) Lottery and this past year saw the successful completion of UDH 38, which is an amazing number. Over the years, revenue streams have been diversified to include several social enterprises. So far, the following are working well: Lottery Management Services (LMS), Read Our Lips, and Sales of Hearing Assistive Technology (General & Post-Secondary). These initiatives along with the two annual lotteries that are held (Ultimate Dream Home and Spring 50/50 Lottery), account for about 95% of total annual revenues. Efforts will continue in the coming year to try to increase the small annual grant of \$15,800 that is received from the Government of NL.

As always, I conclude my comments by extending my personal thanks to our dedicated board, staff, and volunteers. I would also like to extend a sincere thank-you to our wonderful departing board members – President Dan Mahoney, Secretary Jessica Gruchy, Past-President Art Norris and Director Mike Fleming. I've really enjoyed working with you and appreciated your support over the years. Best of luck to you all!

Also, a heartfelt thanks go to my wonderful wife, Jacquie, and my children, Madison, and Sydney, who support me in my work and life. Let's keep sharing the CHHA-NL story!

## **CLIENT SERVICES**

Our client services program provides direct services and information to people with hearing loss. Our free lending program for hearing assistive technology also falls under this program and features a variety of devices, including amplified telephones and TV listening systems, that can be borrowed from anywhere in Newfoundland and Labrador (there were 212 loans this year). # **HEARING SCREENINGS**

Screening Tuesdays is a free hearing screening program that provides hearing screenings by qualified staff at the CHHA-NL office in Mount Pearl. Clients who do not pass the screening are given information about hearing loss treatment, supportive programs, and referral to other hearing health professionals if needed. Most (98%) of the funding for our organization comes from fundraising initiatives and social enterprises, as well as supporting other community lotteries through our Lottery Management Systems. Our most popular fundraising initiative is the Ultimate Dream Home Lottery.
